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Description of Workshops

Tuesday, 10.5.2022

Workshop 1: "Sustainability – Solutions for the future" (Martijn Kiers and Karin Kuchler) Sustainability has become a buzz word. But what is sustainability and how can our society become more sustainable on an economical and technological level? The institute "Energy, Mobility and Environmental Management" of FH JOANNEUM, campus Kapfenberg is happy to offer a workshop titled "Sustainability – solutions for the future" with special focus on the technological and economical side of sustainability. The workshop will include insight into the institute's research, a tour of the energy and mobility labs, as well as practical hints and input on how to become more sustainable on a personal level.

Wednesday, 11.5.2022

Workshop 2: "Social Sustainability in Higher Education" (Katrin Oberhauser and Ena Friess) Most of us probably link questions of sustainability with environmental issues. However, there are more social issues to sustainability as one might think at the first glance. In fact, Sustainable Development - as it is suggested by the United Nation's Agenda 2030 - is inseparably linked to social issues such as health, gender equality or access to education for marginalized groups.

We invite you to get to know the work of the Diversity and Equality Office of FH JOANNEUM as well as to jointly explore the social aspects of sustainability and why they matter to our universities. Furthermore, we will exchange thoughts and strategies on what our universities (can) do to reduce barriers and thus contribute to social sustainability within their own realm.

Thursday, 12.5.2022

<u>Workshop 3: "Sustainable Food Systems"</u> (Ulrike Seebacher and Simon Berner) A transition towards sustainability requires an in-depth understanding of the entire system, we live in. If important aspects of the system are not considered, the probability is quite low to manage a shift towards more sustainable systems.

In the Institute of Applied Production Technologies we focus both on the systemic and organizational level of the agri-food system as well as on the technological level. We provide products, technological, social and business innovations that are derived from an integrated innovation process, that involves all relevant stakeholders and players in the agri-food system. By this, the solutions we derive should have a positive impact for a more sustainable agri-food system.

Our aim is to include sustainability concepts on all organizational levels. Among others this also refers to administration and workplace health promotion. If you are interested in transition and in our research groups "Sustainable Food Systems" and "Sustainable Food Products and Processing", we'll be happy to have a workshop together to exchange experiences and advance sustainability practices.
