Content:

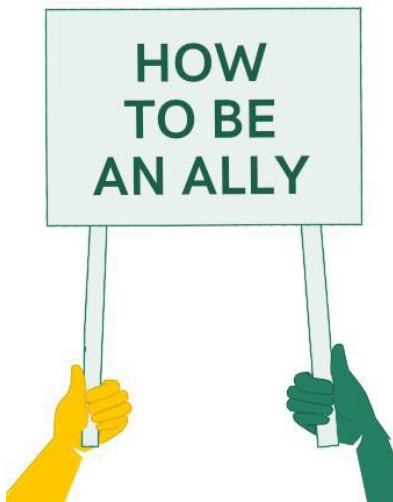
